Spearheaded by ASID Designer Carrie Oesmann and co-chair Mary Brennan, a total of 19 designers accepted this challenge. On November 18th, Katie's House hosted an open house, allowing the general public to view the work of these talented designers.

Although much has been accomplished, much yet remains to be done to make Katie's House a home. Aside from our normal monthly expenses such as mortgage, heat and electric we still must reside the building exterior, finish the large attic, replace the basement steps and put on a new front porch.... Our plan is to accept applications for compatible individuals in January and open the house for residents in mid 2007.
